Network of Independent Media Councils in Africa (NIMCA)

The Network of Independent Media Councils in Africa (NIMCA) is a continental initiative founded to unite independent media content regulatory bodies across Africa. This network emerged following a consultative meeting hosted by the Press Council of South Africa, which brought together independent statutory and non-statutory media regulatory bodies. These bodies operate autonomously, without government interference in their decision-making processes.

NIMCA is envisioned as a collaborative platform through which African media councils can advance shared values, exchange expertise, and collectively uphold professional standards in journalism and content regulation. The establishment of the network is guided by the principles of solidarity, editorial independence, and freedom of expression.

Vision

Media freedom, accountability, and credible journalism as a public good.

Mission

To strengthen independent media content regulatory bodies in Africa and promote self- or co-regulation models that support professional journalism standards, media credibility, and the principles of media freedom and freedom of expression.

Goal

- 7. Formulate collective positions in international multilateral forums and negotiations within the communications ecosystem.
- 8. Advocate for gender equality and inclusivity in media regulation practices.
- 9. Explore the role of media councils in governing digital platforms and managing platform–media relations.

The series was praised for its bold narrative, production quality, and its aim to document and expose the reality of terrorism without seeking commercial profit.


